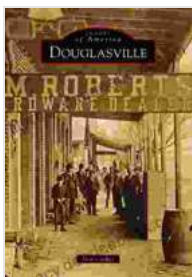


Douglasville Images of America: A Journey Through Time

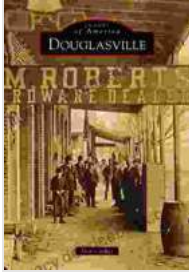

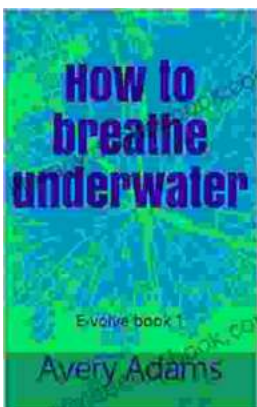
