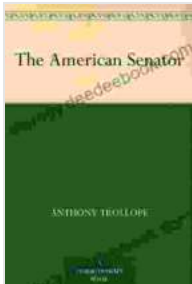


# Johann Peter Eckermann: A Senator with a Literary Legacy

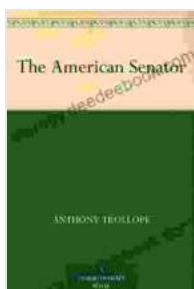

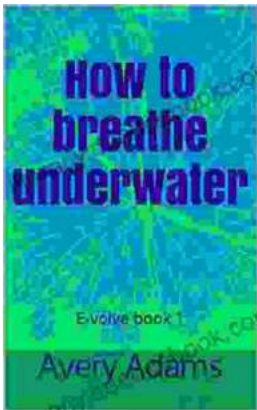
