

Getting to the Racecourse

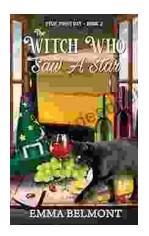

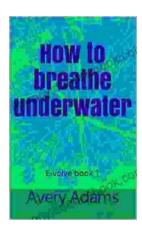
