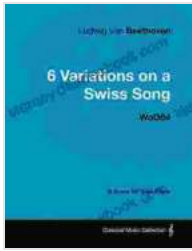

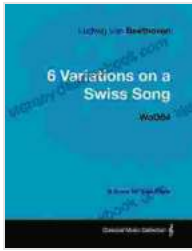
Biography of Joseph Otten

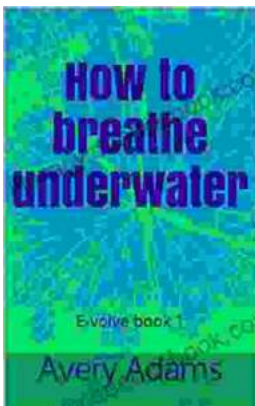
